My Lord -

A short time ~~as weeks~~ since I had the honor of writing to your Lordship a memorial of my services in H.M. Navy with the particulars of a misfortune which attended me during the last war, which I trust ~~would~~ have some weight with you to make your Lordship fully acquainted with my sufferings. But fearing my petition was ~~not~~ yet submitted for your Lordship's perusal, I have with the greatest respect, presumed the liberty of addressing you <sup>the</sup> second time; in behalf of myself who have been twenty years in the Navy, and twelve years a Lieutenant. In the last war, while I belonged to H.M.S. The Crescent, then commanded by Capt. Charles Hope, I was with five others blown up in one of her prizes called The Pilot - None of the six did not survive the event, and myself narrowly escaped with life, but not without bearing the marks of having received mortal injury. I was afterwards captured in the Crescent subsequent to her action with <sup>letter b</sup> M. de Bréil a Dutch frigate; and am now first Lieutenant of H.M.S. La Prompte - On Capt. D'Uchi being appointed to command the Providence I had the honor to be promoted his first Lieutenant.
